

Łukasz Mikołajczyk is a native of Ostrów. He was born on August 12, 1977. Graduated from the Mechanical-and-Electronic Technical Secondary School at the Technical Schools Complex in Ostrów Wielkopolski.

In 2003, he was awarded master's degree at the Opole University of Technology in the major of computer science with a specialisation in computer networks and database systems. Earlier on, he completed a bachelor's degree in computer science at the Pedagogical University of Częstochowa. Furthermore, he has also undertaken numerous forms of professional development and post-graduate education, including post-graduate studies in public relations and crisis management at the Poznań School of Banking or post-graduate studies of the Executive Master of Business Administration at the Managerial College in Warsaw.

In December 2001, he became an ECDL (European Computer Driving Licence) examiner. In 2002, he was awarded the Leader of the Intel Teaching for the Future Scheme Certificate, and a year later he became the trainer of the Intel Teaching for the Future scheme. In 2006 he became an ECDL-A examiner - advanced level.

For dozen-or-so years he has worked at school as a teacher of mathematics and computer science. Between 2007 to 2015, he was the headmaster of Primary School no. 9 named after John Paul II in Ostrów Wielkopolski.

In 2015-2019 he was the Senator of the Republic of Poland of the 9th term. In the Senate, he was the founder and chairperson of the Senate Team for the Safety of Children and Youth in the Virtual World. He has also served as deputy chairperson of the Senate Commission for Human Rights, the Rule of Law and Petitions.

He has obtained the mandate of the councillor of Ostrów District twice. On November 25, 2019, Prime Minister Mateusz Morawiecki presented Łukasz Mikołajczyk with the act of appointing him as the Voivode of Greater Poland.

Privately, he is a happy husband and father of two daughters.
